





A MARINE LITTER SUCCESS STORY | MONITORING PLASTIC POLLUTION ON THE ALGERIAN COASTLINE

A total of 111 beach transects were surveyed located in 9 coastal Wilayas, which extended over a distance of 11,900m and covered a surface area of 574,992 m².

Marine Litter Monitoring




Macrolitter surveys on the sea surface & the seafloor

OVERVIEW OF THE WES ACTIVITIES IN LEBANON, JORDAN AND MOROCCO

Single Use Plastics (SUPs)



Definition of the baseline situation (production and consumption) for selected SUPs

Identification of priorities and recommendations for policy measures for the reduction of SUPs

Support the Ministries of Environment in the development of specific policies to take action to reduce SUP

Also activities on Extended Producers Responsibility (EPR) applied to selected SUPs items (Morocco and Egypt)

Green banking and support to green investment opportunities to curb plastic waste in Jordan

Other related regional activities:

Awareness raising and Education for Sustainable Development: training of trainers on campaigns for sustainable consumption (3 webinars, 61 trainees from 12 countries) (2021)





WES' EXPECTED IMPACT TOWARDS ADDRESSING MARINE LITTER AND SUPS

- Comprehensive diagnosis of the marine litter and SUPs problem (data from more compartments, further consolidation of existing data, etc.)
 - 2 Proposed targeted marine litter prevention and mitigation measures
 - Enhanced capacity of Ministries of Environment to respond to the challenges posed by plastic pollution /waste, with emphasis on SUPs
 - Trained and mobilized core set of professionals on aspects related to the entire management cycle of marine litter
 - 5 Contribution to the upgrading of the national legislation addressing marine litter
- 6 Proposed nationwide strategy for the gradual ban of SUPs (Lebanon, Jordan)

- As part of the WES project, a regional activity took place throughout 2021 resulting in the identification of 20 Mediterranean best practice and the development of a dedicated website 'repository' to promote circular economy and waste reduction across the municipal waste management chain in the Mediterranean.
- Contribution to the **UfM's 2030GreenerMed Agenda** and very specifically to the launching of a Flagship Initiative of **UNEP/MAP's Mediterranean Strategy for Sustainable Development (MSSD 2016-2025).**
- WES, UNEP/MAP, UfM and the Circle of Mediterranean Parliamentarians for Sustainable Development (COMPSUD) launched this collective effort to set the MSSD 2016-2025 Flagship Initiative 3.4.5 into motion.
- The EU through the WES project, and the UfM have co-funded the development of this website: WES consortium members (MIO-ECSDE, ACR+ and LDK Consultants) have contributed in the development of the content, while the UfM contracted the web developers ENT Environment & Management | Fundació ENT for the design and development of the website.

• The cases are a **mix of practices** mostly from the **eight WES partner countries** (Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Palestine, and Tunisia) **with a few from EU Mediterranean** countries;



• Themes addressed different <u>aspects</u>: the involvement of citizens for waste reduction and source separation, collection systems, the relation with human health and informal sector, and <u>instruments</u>: awareness raising, economic instruments, legal requirements, incentives, EPR schemes, etc.



• 20 Individual fact sheets on each of the good practices have been edited in English and French downloadable in pdf (out of 59 identified case studies).



• The repository (https://bestpractices-waste-med.net) offers the opportunity for new practices to be added for future enrichement and expansion.


WES NEW ACTIVITIES ON THE REDUCTION OF PLASTIC POLLUTION



To be carried out at national level, but with the potential to be shared with practically all PCs (also through other on-going regional activities of relevance e.g. P2P).

National activities

- 1. on a road map to effectively recycle plastic polymers (Israel)
- 2. on a compendium on EPR system for plastics in Lebanon and Palestine
- 3. on "model" approaches of separate collection and recycling for further replication in Lebanon & Palestine
- 4. on political and legal measures for the reduction and prohibition of certain types of single-use plastic packaging (Tunisia)
- 5. on solving some persistent separate collection problems identified (Algeria)
- 6. for the preparation of public awareness campaigns material (on plastic pollution management)



Mediterranean Champions

Launching of a "call for interest" on specific interventions and targets. If the target is successfully met, recognize them as "Champion in plastic pollution reduction".

This could be extended to collaborating administrations, so as to lead to some kind of "Achievement Certification" allowing for visibility and political value, *vis-a-vis* their constituencies, possibly helping them with donors as well.
