05 - 10 % of Recycling is mostly done by the informal sector




























Current approaches of waste and circular management in the MENA region

























Link between Waste Management & Tourism

- In 2016: **4.8 million metric tons of waste** (14 % of total MSW) from **tourism** (UNEP, 2016)
- Large use of **SUPs in HORECA** facilities
- Great **seasonal changes** in waste generation
- **Tourists** in Tunisia (e.g.) produce **up to three times as** much solid waste per capita per day as locals


