Given its unique composition as an inter-governmental organisation where all EU and southern Mediterranean partners are members, the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) has been closely involved. The Anna Lindh Foundation (ALF) has also played an important role in the consultations
- The Union for the Mediterranean has experience in building regional networks and leading flagship projects. With its convening power, the UfM will support the joint group meetings, and it will also be a partner in the roll-out of the Pact, including through its ministerial meetings.
- The UfM has developed expertise in specific areas such as Education, Employment and Economic Development, Water, Environment and Blue Economy; Crisis management and civil protection

28 November – Meeting of UfM Foreign Affairs Ministers. Palau de Pedralbes, Barcelona



Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the Union for the Mediterranean will gather in Barcelona to address the region's most pressing challenges — notably the alarming situation in the Middle East — and to reflect on the future of the Euro-Mediterranean Partnership. Marking the 30th Anniversary of the Barcelona Process, the meeting will serve as an opportunity to endorse the UfM's new strategic vision.

The Meeting will be chaired by Kaja Kallas, the High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy and Vice President of the European Commission, alongside Ayman Safadi, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates of Jordan.



ASSESSMENT VIA HARMONISED MONITORING APPROACHES

Addressing data gaps and needs with regards to marine litter, to complement existing assessments carried out in the region as well as the further development and practical implementation of harmonized monitoring approaches in line with the related advances made at Barcelona Convention and EU levels.

ACTION 2 DEMO ACTIONS FOR TESTING PREVENTION & MITIGATION MEASURES

Developing and coordinating the implementation of demonstration projects showcasing actions to prevent, reduce and mitigate marine litter in the Mediterranean Sea, based on the measures provided by the Barcelona Convention Regional Plan on Marine Litter Management in the Mediterranean, the EU MSFD Programmes of Measures, the EU SUPs Directive, etc.

The Plastic Busters Initiative kick-started in 2013 to address some of the scientific and policy gaps existing at the time in the Mediterranean region. Since then, improvements have been implemented on the science policy interface, with Plastic Busters contributing to the regional policy context as well as being informed by it. Born under the umbrella of SDSN Mediterroneon (United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network), the Initiative provides a concrete apportunity to like-minded projects dealing with marine litter issues to get together and fully explore the potential for synergies towards ensuring aligned and synchronized marine litter activities across the Mediterranean. The Plastic Busters Initiative strives to push forward a shared common objective: to effectively tackle the issue of marine litter in the Mediterronean by addressing its entire management cycle, from monitoring and assessment to prevention and mitigation, thus contributing to evidence- and science-based support to governance.

Led by the University of Sieno (scientific Coordinator Prof. Maria Cristina Fossi), and implemented by a consortium of 15 Partners. from around the Mediterranean, the Plastic Busters Initiative works in four key areas of intervention:

Strengthering the science-policy interface by providing fit-for-purpose mains litter data; recommendations for a comprehensive and harmonized marine litter monitoring strategy; concrete showcases and guidelines for operationalizing best practice marine litter measures; capacity building of institutional actors on marine litter related hauses, etc.

ACTION 4 CAPACITY BUILDING & AWARENESS RAISING

Designing and coordinating the implementation of awareness training campaigns and education for sustainable development programmes, tailor-enade to the needs of different stakeholders, including the educational community.


